Vocabulary: past simple of be: was / were word formation: write > writer / go, have e get / past time expressions

Pronunciation: sentence stress / verbs -ed endings

Week 2 –

Grammar: past simple: regular and irregular verbs / there is / there are, some / any + plural nouns / there was / there were

Vocabulary: irregular verbs/ the house / the house / prepositions: place and Movement

Pronunciation: /eə/ and /ɪə/ silent letters

Week 3 –

Grammar: countable / uncountable nouns; a / an, some / any / quantifiers: how much / how many, a lot of, etc. / comparative adjectives
